Since 2002, MAU has developed principles and programs all intended to ***inspire, educate*** and ***engage*** a growing movement of mothers (and others). MAU has active members in all 50 states and 23 countries who have held 80+ Mother's Day events across the country. MAU intends to engage a *million* mothers (or as many as it takes) in advocating for the world's children, until children's wellbeing is front-page news and our public & corporate policies are measured by how they impact children wherever they live on earth.
